- Join or establish a Neighborhood Watch Program.
- Know your neighbors. Those days when everyone knew their neighbors seem to have vanished. Reach out to the people living around you for a safer neighborhood.
- Unless you're outside, keep your garage door closed, especially when you leave to run errands
- Always lock your vehicle doors and never leave anything of value in your car.
- Don't hesitate to report any and all suspicious activity.

Halloween Safety Tips:

- Parents, establish a route for children within a familiar area. Always accompany younger children.
- Remind your children never to enter a stranger's home or car. And tell them to avoid homes without an outside light on.

- Be careful of masks or head gear that can interfere with your child's eyesight.
- Make sure clothing is bright or reflective and flame retardant. Have them watch for open flames from jack-o-lanterns as they go door to door
- Establish the strict rule of not eating treats until they return home and you have inspected all candy.
- Any fake knives, swords or guns should be made of cardboard or other flexible material to avoid injury.

Parents, make your home safe for little trick-or-treaters as well.

- Turn on your porch light. Make the evening a neighborhood event. Sit out with neighbors to distribute treats.
- Move lighted pumpkins away from porch, stairs or anywhere a trick-or-treater may walk. Better yet, use battery operated candles when possible.

This past summer we have completed several projects involving drainage work and culverts, road repair, edge of road repair, brush trimming and mowing, brush pick up program, signage on the road, truck and equipment repairs and maintenance, resurfacing and various other jobs on over 90 miles of road.

We also provide emergency services when needed. We are on call 24 hours a day and can be reached through the Sheriff's Office if needed after regular office hours. Please be sure to call the Road District phone number not the Supervisor's Office if you have flooding problems, signs down, trees down or any other emergency situation that needs immediate assistance. If the situation arises and you are in need of sand bags because of flooding please call our office and we will get them out to you right away. Remember, we can't help if we don't know you need it, so call the Township Road District @ 630-584-3496. The Kane County Office of Emergency Management can also be called @ 630-208-2050 when help is needed in emergency situations.

Managing Your Leaves

Mulching - Leave shredded material on lawn and around trees and shrubs. Do not put leaves or grass for mulching in roadways or ditches. They will plug up storm drains, especially in subdivisions that have curbs, and will cause flooding.

Composting - Produce a valuable soil amendment for garden areas.

Bagged Collection of Leaves & Other Landscape Wastes - Local garbage companies provide this service for a fee.

Suggestions:

- 1. No single approach will easily handle all your leaves. Try mulching as many as you possibly can, composting some and bagging the rest for your garbage pickup.
- 2. Always shred or chop your leaves. Chopped leaves work best for mulch, compost faster, and fill fewer yard waste bags.

Snow Season



The winter weather will soon be here. We are asking everyone to buckle up and drive safely throughout the season.

We will make every effort to keep your streets clear and safe for you. We will have it done for you in a timely manner. We can only do that with your cooperation. Please **DO NOT** park your vehicle along the roadways until after they have been plowed and widened. We've been having a problem with parents parking by school bus pickups. Remember, we can't plow if cars are parked on the road. Please be considerate of our plows and move if our trucks are in the vicinity trying to plow the roads. We are doing this for you and the safety of your children.

If your mailbox is accidentally pushed over during a snowfall by one of the township snow plows please call the township and we will correct the situation as soon as possible. In the meantime try to place the mailbox temporarily upright so your mail will get delivered. We **DO NOT** fix mailboxes if they are knocked over by someone backing into them, another vehicle hitting them or a hired snow plow company clearing a drive and pushing the snow into your mailbox. Remember, no one knocks these mailboxes over on purpose. They are just trying to move the snow. Most of the time it's the weight of the snow pushed up against an old post that causes the post to break. If the township has to replace a mailbox it will be replaced with a legal mailbox and post as required by the United States Postal Service, not the fancy mailboxes that may have been there before.

Leaf Disposal and "Brush Only" Burning Regulations

Effective January 1, 2003 open burning of "landscape waste" and /or other materials, with the exception of **Brush** is prohibited in the unincorporated areas of Kane County. The definition of "**Brush**" means trunks, limbs, branches, and twigs.

Kane County has a burn ordinance that prohibits the burning of "Landscape Waste," which means all accumulations of grass or shrubbery cuttings, leaves, flowers and weeds. You may however still burn "**Brush**" as long as you follow the Standard Restrictions that are listed below.

STANDARD RESTRICTIONS:

- Only on property upon which the landscape waste of brush was generated;
- Only on sunny days from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm;
- Not when wind exceeds 10 mph;
- Not within 20ft. of any building, structure, or property line;
- Not during announced inversion conditions or ozone alerts.
- Any burning must be supervised until the fire is extinguished; a fire extinguisher, garden hose or other water source must be available at the burning site.

EXEMPTIONS:

- Any property zoned or used for agricultural purposes;
- Burning for the purpose of prairie restoration or firefighter training;
- Burning of brush for recreational fires, but the fire cannot be larger than 3'x3'x3';
- Ceremonial fires for a scheduled public or private event. Notice must be given to the local Fire Department and a permit obtained from the Kane County Health Department (630) 208-3801.

PENALTIES;

- Any person who violates any provision shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100 for a first offense and a fine of \$500 for subsequent offenses.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION BEFORE Digging, Building, Planting in the Road Right-of-Way

The road right-of-way is the area usually 33' from the center of the road (some roads vary). That area (33' from the center of the road) belongs to the Road District. You *must* get permission from the Highway Commissioner to do anything in that easement area. Boulders, rocks, underground fencing and sprinkler systems must be kept out of the road right-of-way. Stay in your property line when installing these things.

Also, MONUMENT MAILBOXES on the road right-of-way are illegal and not safe to the motoring public. Mailboxes must not be bigger than a 4x4 post per USPS Regulations. When these regulations are not followed properly and things are built or planted in the road right-of-way it costs the taxpayer because the township is forced to pay legal fees to have these situations remedied.

Please contact the Road District before putting anything in the easement (right-of-way) in front of your house.

REMEMBER: Call J.U.L.I.E. Before you dig. If you are having a **Contractor** performing the work, *They* must call, not you. Please do not dig without marks unless a utility has indicated there are no facilities in the dig area.

When you call for Service, provide:

- Your name, address, and telephone number
- County and city or unincorporated township
- Location of the dig site
- Extent of the work involved (reason for dig)
- Date work will begin
- Permit number (if applicable)
- Section and quarter section number (if available)

Did you know...that J.U.L.I.E. stands for **Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators.**



Salvation Army Tri-City Corps in St. Charles

Social Services: The Tri-City Social Services Department helps residents with needs for social services such as rental, utility, prescription, eyeglass, and other assistance.

Joe K. Anderson Community Center: The community center provides after-school and summer programs for children along with various programming for adults such as open walking in the gym, seated exercise classes, Pickleball, line dancing, yoga, computer/smart phone classes and even game days.

Food Pantry: The Tri-City Corps has a food pantry for those in need within the area. Relying on the kindness of our community to help keep the shelves stocked, the food pantry is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. by calling and registering. In addition, there is a fresh food distribution that takes place on Tuesdays through Fridays from 10:00 a.m.--1:00 p.m., which is open to everyone. No paperwork needed.

Salvation Army Corps: The Salvation Army is also a church. It is an evangelical part of the universal Christian Church and offers a family-oriented worship service to allow all ages to continue to grow in their faith and strives to impart a sense of unity and community while learning God's truth. Worship service is at 11:00 a.m.

Major Joel Harmon, who leads the Salvation Army Tri-City Corps alongside his wife, Major Rhonda Harmon, says, "Our mission statement states, 'The Salvation Army, an international movement, is an evangelical part of the universal Christian church. Its message is based on the Bible. Its ministry is motivated by the love of God. Its mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination.' The programs we offer are not only in line with this mission but help us to better connect with the community we serve."

Lazarus House - Neighbors Helping Neighbors

Homelessness among families continues to be an issue in our area. Residents of Unincorporated St. Charles Township who are disabled or over the age of 65 may participate in Ride in Kane, sponsored by St. Charles Township.

Residents may ride within Kane County for 3 round trip rides per week or 6 one-way trips. The purpose of these rides may be for medical, dental, therapy or chiropractic appointments, a job, to the Elderday Center or to school.

The fee to the rider is **\$5.00** each way for the first 10 miles. After 10 miles a \$1.50 per mile over 10 will be charged. St. Charles Township, as the Sponsor, will fund the balance. The average cost of a one way ride is approximately \$15.

Residents within **Unincorporated** St. Charles Township can register for rides by calling 630-584-9342.

Residents within the **city limits** of St. Charles can receive information about their ride program by calling 630-377-4426.

To schedule rides, please contact the Ride in Kane Call Center at 866-727-6842. Rides should be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance. Same day reservations are not guaranteed. Reservation hours are between 6am and 6pm, Monday-Friday and between 8am and 5pm, Saturday and Sunday. Trips can reserved up to 7 days in advance.

Transportation services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year including holidays.

To cancel a ride, please call 866-727-6842, providing us with at least a 2 hour or more notice.
