FROM THE ST. CHARLES TOWNSHIP ASSESSOR Diane Hemmingsen, CIAO

As your Assessor, I am committed to serving our community with transparency, fairness and dedication. My team and I are here to ensure that property assessments are conducted accurately and equitably, while also addressing your questions and concerns with the care and attention they deserve.

Real estate tax assessments play a vital role in determining property taxes for homeowners and businesses in St. Charles Township. These assessments serve as the foundation for local government revenue, funding services such as schools, Kane County Forest Preserve, St. Charles Park District, the St. Charles Library, infrastructure maintenance for the City of St. Charles, if you are within the City limits, or for the St. Charles Township, if you are unincorporated, just to name a few of the taxing bodies. You can review all of the taxing bodies that you pay taxes to by looking at the bottom of your tax bill.

The assessment of your property is an estimation of the property's market value based on sales from the prior three years. So for 2025, sales from 2022, 2023 and 2024 will be used to determine assessments. State law governs this process. The St. Charles Township Assessor follows the state statutes for valuing properties.

The 2024 housing market in St. Charles Township demonstrated continued growth in sales prices. There are several new subdivisions in St. Charles Township, but the inventory of homes for sale in established neighborhoods is limited. While everyone appreciates the fact that their real estate investments have increased in value, no one enjoys paying taxes. You play an important role in making sure the value on your property is correct. Please review your assessment on the St. Charles Township Assessor's website at stcharlestownship.org under "Parcel Information." Make sure the details about your home are correct. Also, if you recently purchased your home in an "arms-length" transaction, and the value the assessor has on your parcel does not closely reflect the sales price you should contact the assessor's office so that we can review this with you and make an adjustment if necessary. Typically new assessments are established by August, so make sure to check the township website to see what your current value is or visit the Kane County Supervisor of Assessments website at: assessments website at: assessments.kanecountyil.gov. You do not need to have an attorney or tax service do this for you. We are always glad to help property owners and will work with you in making sure your property assessment is fair and equitable.

We are currently working on establishing values for 2025, which will be reflected on your 2026 tax bill. A notice will be posted on our website that will state when the new values will be available.

A Message from your Highway Commissioner

Well, we've had a pretty mild winter and looks like Spring is wanting to come soon. With the start of Spring we'll soon be headed into that next season in Illinois and that is "Construction" season. With the county and state having projects going on all the time we can always expect some kind of traffic detours. So be *careful*.

The last couple of years we've been able to resurface 5+ miles of road with blacktop costing about \$90/ton. This year we are only resurfacing 4+ miles of road since we are grinding almost all of these roads before resurfacing which makes the cost higher. When determining what roads to resurface each year I always look at how long it's been since it was resurfaced last and what condition it is in. The township has over 90 miles of road to maintain. Therefore, the roads in the worse condition and the longest time since being resurfaced will come first. Most roads being resurfaced are anywhere from 15 - 20 years since they were last resurfaced. We try to patch other roads as quickly as we can to help with their longevity.

Just a reminder to those of you that should have any trouble with flooding, if you need immediate assistance, first please call Kane County Office of Emergency Management at 630.232.5985. Then call the township for sand bags or sand if during regular office hours at 630.584.3496 or the Sheriff's Department if after hours at 630.232.6840 for an emergency and they can get a hold of us. Remember, we can't help if we are not contacted.

In closing, I would like to say I look forward to working for you, the taxpayers, for many years to come. I want to thank you in advance for your support and if you have any questions or problems please don't hesitate to call me at my office.

SUMMER CONSTRUCTION & SAFETY

Please be aware and watch for construction workers on the roads. Their safety is in your hands. Whether it's Township, County, State, Municipality, Utility, or Blacktop Crews - they all should be obeyed. Please reduce your speed, stop talking or texting on your cell phone and pay attention to the road signs and the Flagger's!

Brush Pickup for Unincorporated Township:

Note: NOT City of St. Charles 2025 Pickup Begins April 28

St. Charles Township Road District has contracted with Kramer Tree Service to pick up brush in unincorporated St. Charles Township this year.

Please follow these procedures to ensure your brush will be picked up:

- Brush/limbs are to be out by the road, not in the road, no later than 7am on the Monday of the scheduled pick up week
- Max diameter is 12 inches; Max length is 12 feet
- Stack brush in large piles with cut ends facing the road keeping away from mailboxes, utility poles/boxes, hydrants and parked cars.
- Brush should be placed in the front or side parkway: it will not be picked up from vacant lots
- Do not tie or bundle brush/limbs or put brush/limbs in containers or bags
- Do not place stumps, roots, landscape material, lumber, firewood, or foreign objects in piles.
- This program is strictly for resident generated brush; NOT FOR CONTRACTOR REMOVALS OR TRIMMINGS
- If you hire a tree service, they are responsible for taking away all logs & brush
- We do not pick up after any lot clearings
- Limbs/brush exceeding the requirements for the Residential Brush Pickup Program can hire a private service to have them removed at the resident's expense.
- If your brush was out at 7am on Monday of the scheduled pickup week and NOT collected by the end of the workday on Friday, please notify the Road District no later then the following Monday. For calls on missed brush removal received after that Monday, the brush will be picked up at the next scheduled pickup week.

2025 Township Brush Pickup Schedule

Brush pickup is on the 4th Monday of each month (which is not always the last week of the month) from April to October.

April 28, May 27, June 23, July 28, August 25, September 22, October 27 (last pickup for 2025)

Yard Waste

Residents in unincorporated areas who would like yard waste pickup service (not brush pickup) should contact their refuse hauler for details.



St. Charles Township does not provide yard waste pickup; however, many of the contracted waste haulers do offer this service.

<u>Leaf Disposal and "Brush Only" Burning</u> <u>Regulations</u>

Effective January 1, 2003 open burning of "landscape waste" and /or other materials, with the exception of **Brush** is prohibited in the unincorporated areas of Kane County. The definition of "**Brush**" means trunks, limbs, branches, and twigs.

Kane County has a burn ordinance that prohibits the burning of "Landscape Waste," which means all accumulations of grass or shrubbery cuttings, leaves, flowers and weeds. You may however still burn "**Brush**" as long as you follow the Standard Restrictions that are listed below.

STANDARD RESTRICTIONS:

- Only on property upon which the landscape waste of brush was generated;
- Only on sunny days from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm;
- Not when wind exceeds 10 mph;
- Not within 20ft. of any building, structure, or property line;
- Not during announced inversion conditions or ozone alerts.
- Any burning must be supervised until the fire is extinguished; a fire extinguisher, garden hose or other water source must be available at the burning site.

EXEMPTIONS:

- Any property zoned or used for agricultural purposes;
- Burning for the purpose of prairie restoration or firefighter training;
- Burning of brush for recreational fires, but the fire cannot be larger than 3'x3'x3';
- Ceremonial fires for a scheduled public or private event. Notice must be given to the local Fire Department and a permit obtained from the Kane County Health Department (630) 208-3801.

PENALTIES;

- Any person who violates any provision shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100 for a first offense and a fine of \$500 for subsequent offenses.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION BEFORE Digging, Building, Planting in the Road Right-of-Way

The road right-of-way is the area usually 33' from the center of the road (some roads vary). That area (33' from the center of the road) belongs to the Road District. You must get permission from the Highway Commissioner to do anything in that easement area. Boulders, rocks, underground fencing and sprinkler systems must be kept out of the road right-of-way. Stay in your property line when installing these things.

Also, MONUMENT MAILBOXES on the road right-of-way are illegal and not safe to the motoring public. Mailboxes must not be bigger than a 4x4 post per USPS Regulations. When these regulations are not followed properly and things are built or planted in the road right-of-way it costs the taxpayer because the township is forced to pay legal fees to have these situations remedied.

Please contact the Road District before putting anything in the easement (right-of-way) in front of your house.



JUNK CARS

If you have a problem with vehicle parking, please call the Sheriff's Office first. If you have a problem with junk

cars that are abandoned in your neighborhood please call the Kane County Health Department because it is a health problem. Their number is 630.208.3801.

AEROSOL PRODUCTS & PROPANE CANISTERS

These products are accepted on specific dates as listed on the calendar.

- There is a cost to recycle these products, payable by the resident with cash or card. (Spray cans \$1 each, Small Propane Canisters \$3 each)
- Propane Canisters: only small camp-sized cans are accepted (14.1 oz 16.4 oz) \$3/ea
- Spray paint, sealer, stains, rust control
- Insecticide, repellent, pesticide
- Inhalers (for asthma)
- Household cleaners, polishes, disinfectants, protectants
- Personal care products, for hair, face, and skin
- Cooking spray, food products, whipped cream
- Auto lubricant, starter fluid, tar remover, brake cleaner
- Please see online for the full list of accepted materials and cost.

DOCUMENT SHREDDING

Free confidential document shredding on specific dates as listed on the calendar.

- This free service provides on-site shredding trucks.
- Staples, paperclips, spiral bindings, file folders without metal, and envelope windows are fine to leave in. Please REMOVE all binder clips, three-ring plastic binders and any larger metal pieces.
- Please do not bring periodicals, magazines, and other paper that does not contain confidential information.
- We will receive documents for shredding only until the trucks are full, and may finish before 12pm.
- Quantity limit is approximately equal to 4 banker boxes (12"width x 16"depth x 10"height) full of residential documents (per vehicle).
- No business material will be accepted.
- This is a free public service for residents to have their confidential documents securely shredded. No businesses please.

ANNUAL RECYCLING EXTRAVAGANZA

LATEX PAINT

Paint recycling is offered on specific dates as listed on the calendar.

- Latex paint has a recycling fee per container, payable by the resident with cash or card. (Quart \$1; Gallon \$3; 2-gallon \$5; 5-gallon \$15)
- \bullet This program is for liquid latex paint, which is recycled into reusable product.
- Please do not bring dried out paint, which can be disposed of in your regular trash (a couple cans per week in the trash can).

REMEMBER: Call J.U.L.I.E. Before you dig. If you are having a **Contractor** performing the work, **They** must call, not you. Please do not dig without marks unless a utility has indicated there are no facilities in the dig area.

When you call for Service, provide:

- Your name, address, and telephone number
- County and city or unincorporated township
- Location of the dig site
- Extent of the work involved (reason for dig)
- Date work will begin
- Permit number (if applicable)
- Section and quarter section number (if available)

Did you know...that J.U.L.I.E. stands for **Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators.**

Residents of Unincorporated St. Charles Township who are disabled or over the age of 65 may participate in Ride in Kane, sponsored by St. Charles Township.

Residents may ride within Kane County for 3 round trip rides per week or 6 one-way trips. The purpose of these rides may be for medical, dental, therapy or chiropractic appointments, a job, to the Elderday Center or to school.

The fee to the rider is **\$5.00 each** way for the first 10 miles. After 10 miles a \$2.00 per mile over 10 will be charged. St. Charles Township, as the Sponsor, will fund the balance. The average cost of a one way ride is approximately \$15.

Residents within **Unincorporated**St. Charles Township can register for rides by calling 630-584-9342.

Residents within the **city limits** of St. Charles can receive information about their ride program by calling 630-377-4426.

To schedule rides, please contact the Ride in Kane Call Center at 866-727-6842. Rides should be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance. Same day reservations are not guaranteed. Reservation hours are between 6am and 6pm, Monday-Friday and between 8am and 5pm, Saturday and Sunday. Trips can reserved up to 7 days in advance.

Transportation services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year including holidays.

Lazarus House - **Community** based **support** honoring the **dignity** of all.

Homelessness among families is rising nationwide and it is no different here in St. Charles. Many families are living on incomes that fall short of what is needed for stable housing in central Kane County. A lost job, reduced work hours, family conflict, an unexpected expense, or violence in the home can push households into homelessness.

Lazarus House has been blessed to step in and help these families by offering emergency shelter, transitional living and homeless prevention programs to individuals from Batavia, Geneva, St. Charles and western rural Kane County.

This trend is not going away, in just the first nine months of the current fiscal year, the number of children served (41) has already surpassed the total from the previous year (37). With no end in sight as rents continue to rise in central Kane County, Lazarus House remains committed to providing shelter and services to all our neighbors experiencing homelessness.

In total last fiscal year, Lazarus House provided shelter to 175 individuals for a total of 18,178 nights of shelter and over 54,534 meals to those in the community in need. Our Homeless Prevention Services assisted in helping 112 individuals avoid homelessness with one-time rental or utility assistance.
